#### Changing Paradigm of Forestry Policy in Indonesia: "Toward Promotion of Community-based Sustainable Forest Management"

Tokyo, 28 June 2018 (Time: 09.30 – 17.00)



Japan has always been a prominent supporter in forest management and environmental conservations in Indonesia. Cooperation between Indonesia and Japan on forestry has been going for more than 35 years with the issues ranging from timber trade, forest fire, national park management to satellite technology. The relationship had been multi-layered involving not only government but business, NGOs, universities/academics and social and cultural institutions. The 60th anniversary of Indonesia-Japan Diplomatic Relations is a strategic momentum for the two countries to reflect what the two countries have achieved together and look forward to a vibrant partnership in the future.

Currently, the Government of Indonesia has issued various policies by changing the paradigm of forest management in Indonesia, from "timber-based management" to "ecosystem resources based management" based on "community based forest management". These policies aim to ensure that forests can be harnessed sustainably, harmoniously and equitably for the welfare of Indonesian society in particular and humanity in general, both present and future toward the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

This seminar aims at sharing the development of forest conditions, government policies and current industrial developments in the forestry sector, the milestone achievements, major environmental issues, threats and constraints existing in Indonesia among Japanese Government and its people, as Indonesia's partners who have an interest in the issues on environmental and forestry in Indonesia.

- a. Provide the update information on the forest conditions, government policies and current industrial developments in the forestry sector toward Sustainable Forest Management (SFM) in Indonesia
- b. Exchange opinions to resolve the issues related to SFM as well as conservation and rehabilitation of natural resources (including ecosystems and biodiversity) that has synergy with business and investment considering all Japan efforts to promote SDGs contributes to the conservation and rehabilitation in the future.
- c. Explore the potential of the cooperation area in the development of SFM in Indonesia that can improve people's welfare.
- d. Sharing information on efforts that have been and should be done in the development of SFM, which has been implemented by various Japanese organizations in Indonesia
- e. Updates of the recent implementation of Indonesian progress on forest certification (Indonesia TLAS) as the milestone achievements for forest governance in Indonesia
- f. Supporting national policies in developing and increasing production of NTFPs.
- g. Identify major environmental issues, threats and constraints existing in Indonesia.

**Expected Outcomes:**

- a. Strengthening the cooperation and collaboration between Indonesia and Japan on the promoting the SFM in Indonesia.
- b. Sharing experiences, lessons and issues for good practice on promoting Sustainable management of forest in Indonesia.
- c. Promoting communication among and environment and forestry stakeholders both in Indonesia and Japan. All stakeholders in Japan, particularly the Government of Japan, could make a better decisions and strategic policies for the purposes of promoting Sustainable Management of forests in Indonesia.
- d. Establishing corporation of local people group surrounding forest and cooperative action for strengthening supply chain management to ensure legality / sustainability of small and medium-sized enterprise products / market support etc.
